San Luis Coastal Unified School District offers a preschool and parent education program for low and moderate income families. It is free of cost to qualified families. The program is offered at four of our elementary school sites, Baywood, Hawthorne, Pacheco, and C.L. Smith Elementary. **We are seeking families with children not already enrolled in preschool programs.**

To be eligible for the program, your child must be at least 4 years old by December 2, 2018, reside within the San Luis Coastal Unified School District, and demonstrate financial need. We will consider older 3 year olds if space is available. Children who live in the Baywood, Hawthorne, or C.L. Smith attendance areas will be given enrollment priority for those preschools. Children who have siblings attending Pacheco will be given enrollment priority for Pacheco's preschool. Children who are learning English as a second language will be given priority at all sites. Toileting skills are required. To be considered for the preschool program, parents must provide proof of residence, child's birth certificate, a copy of the child's Official Immunization Record and the most current full month pay stub or Federal 1040 form.

In order to qualify for our preschool program parents are required to commit to the following:

- Children must attend five days per week for a 3-hour period
- Transport students to preschool and pick them up at the designated time
- Attend parent education meetings, once a month in the evening

Initial applications for enrollment will be available at Baywood Elementary, Hawthorne Elementary, C.L. Smith Elementary, Pacheco Elementary and Instructional Services beginning March 5, 2018. Completed initial applications and documentation should be dropped off at one of the four elementary sites. Notification letters will be sent to all families via mail.

- **For Baywood, live in the Baywood boundaries**
- **For Hawthorne, live in the Hawthorne boundaries**
- **For C.L. Smith, live in the C.L. Smith boundaries**
- **English Learner students are a high priority**
- **4 years old by December 2, 2018**

- ❖ A caring, fully-credentialed teacher and instructional aide in each class
- ❖ An adult to student ratio of 1 to 9
- ❖ An environment that welcomes children of all cultural, ethnic, and linguistic backgrounds
- ❖ Learning opportunities for children in whole-class activities, small group, and individual interactions with the teacher
- ❖ Instruction for English Learners and oral language development for all children
