

## Information for Parents/Guardians

### School Use of the Internet for Learning

SLCUSD makes computers and the Internet available to students while at school, and students may have access to databases, web sites and other resources to which the district has subscribed. Students might also publish online. Students are expected to use computers and the Internet responsibly and for school-related purposes only.

Use of the SLCUSD network is a privilege and not a right. Violations of conditions of use may result in that privilege being taken away in whole, or in part, by school district personnel. All other consequences, including suspension or expulsion, may follow. Please review the “Student Technology Acceptable Use Agreement” provided with the annual Parent Booklet of Information.

### Home Use of the Internet for Learning

Parent involvement and supervision are critical to ensuring your child’s safety on the Internet. SLCUSD assists you by providing home access to resources that support your child’s learning. The following resources are available from home as well as school:

#### How to Find Web Sites from Home

**School Web Site:** School web pages provide direct access to resources as well as class web pages where teachers can post additional resources selected to support your child’s learning. Go to SLCUSD web site and click “Our Schools.” Select school. Click on “Visit Our Website” under “Resources.”

**Online Library Catalog:** Students can search for books in the school library by reading level or topic at <http://destiny.slcusd.org>

**ETC Portal:** Students may use the ETC Portal at [www.etcportal.org](http://www.etcportal.org) to access a variety of online research tools

**Online Textbook Services:** Students in grades three through five may access their math textbook materials at [www.pearsonsuccessnet.com](http://www.pearsonsuccessnet.com). Sixth graders may access their math textbook materials at <http://my.hrw.com>.

**Other Research Tools:** More District online tools may be found at <http://edtech.slcusd.org/resources>. Each school may have access to additional online tools and services.

## What You Can Do with a Computer at School

You can do many things with computers at school:

- Take online tests and quizzes;
- Use web pages that your teacher or librarian has selected for you;
- Search for resources on the Internet related to school projects;
- Create documents and multi-media projects; and
- Participate in education related activities, web quests, scavenger hunts, games, interactive tutorials, and more.

## Technology and Internet Usage Expectations

- I will use the Internet and other computer resources for school-related purposes only.
- I will follow the guidelines for printing set by my teacher or librarian.
- I will only save material in my P drive that is appropriate for educational use.
- I will not send or access inappropriate, indecent, harassing, or otherwise hurtful material in any form.
- I will not give out my name, picture, address, or any other personally identifying information online.



- I will not access chat rooms or social networking sites, unless it is a Moodle site directly supervised by a teacher.
- I will not attempt to deliberately harm or destroy data on any system on the SLCUSD Network.
- I will not damage computer equipment or alter computer settings.
- I will not alter or damage other student's files.
- I will not install, store or share copyrighted files, music, software on District computers or network
- I will turn in work that I have created myself. If I borrow or copy material from other sources, I will properly cite those sources.
- I will not share my password with anyone.
- I will not use my own cell phone, camera or digital music player during school unless I have teacher and parent permission.



## What Happens if You Break the Rules?

- You may lose your computer privileges at school, even if it lowers your grade.
- You could face other disciplinary consequences.
